BUSSING INFORMATION

TRANSPORTATION NEWS:

- Parents/guardians requesting changes to bus stops must put their change request in writing (Bus Change Request Form) and email the form to the Transportation Department. Change requests for convenience and/or proximity to residences will not be considered.
- Requests will be accepted until the 15th of October and assessed according to the guidelines outlined in the Transportation Parent Handbook to keep the ride times to a minimum. Requests for a second bus stop or a bus stop at daycare will not be accommodated; however, we can allow students to use a different bus route if space is available and there is an existing stop along that route. Students are assigned to their community routes as this is how we balance the student loads per route. Please notify the Transportation Department immediately if you plan to have your student use a stop other than your community stop.
- All change requests will be accepted but not addressed until October/November (unless there is a safety concern) as per the Transportation Agreement that parents/guardians agree to when signing up their students to ride the bus.
- Please note: all requests to change, provide or cancel bus service must be sent by email to the Transportation Department. Campuses cannot make changes to your transportation.

GRADE 9 HIGH SCHOOL SKILLS DAY CONFERENCE



On Friday, the 15th of this month we looked forward to the long-awaited return of our "Skills Day" tradition at the high school. On this day, students in grade, rather than attending their regularly scheduled classes, were treated to five seminars presented by older students, staff, and our administrator team!

The themes included for the five seminars were: People, Brains, Screens, Books and Values. During the 'People' session, Gr. 12 and 11 student-leaders presented a lesson prepared by staff on the importance of social skills, healthy vs. unhealthy relationships, and bullying. The 'Brains' session examined the effects of stress, its impact on learning, as well as strategies for recognizing and addressing the stress we feel, delivered by our family school liaison counsellor and a grade 12 student-leader. The screens session, delivered by three gr. 12 student-leaders, encouraged students to examine the difference between active and passive screen time spent on their electronic devices. During the 'Books' session, led by grade 10 student-leaders, grade 9 students were encouraged to examine their distractors and ideal study environment. Finally, our very own administrative team provided a session on 'Values' in which students were reminded of FFCA's core values and encouraged to examine their own values and how they can be honored.

While we have not had the opportunity to offer this day of learning to our grade 9 students in several years, we are thrilled to bring back the tradition and look forward to continuing the High School Skills Conference again next year. Student feedback regarding the day has been positive and we encourage you to discuss with your grade 9 students how they felt about the learning they did on this September Friday, and what they took away from the sessions they attended.





ANTI-DISTRATION GUIDELINES



Anti-Distraction Guidelines

The anti-distraction guidelines are implemented to create a learning environment that promotes focus, productivity, and a positive learning experience for students. These guidelines are designed to minimize distractions that can interfere with a student's focus and engagement. The guideline for staff allows them to be role models for students as well as prioritize their personal and professional lives.

For Students:

- After the uniform check, students' phones will be turned off or set it to "Do Not Disturb" and will
 be placed in their bag for the duration of class unless specifically required to use them by a
 teacher for educational purposes only.
- Headphones will also be placed in their bags for the duration of the class unless specifically required to use them by a teacher for educational purposes only.
- 3. Students are permitted to use their phones at lunch and before and after school.
- 4. Exceptions can be made for specific students with unique learning needs.





For Staff:

 Staff are expected to not post on Edsby, send an Edsby message or email students after 6pm unless there is an emergency or change to program that necessitates communication, <u>i.e.</u> field trip cancellation, etc.


